

Videos Update from Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland

LL-R have updated their fantastic video which follows the ICON touchpoint steps from antenatal contact through to the GP 6-8 week check-up. The video features discussions with parents where ICON is explained, such as with the community midwife and health visitor. The Crying Curve is discussed at every touchpoint. There is also useful information regarding texting parents.


The original LL-R touchpoint video shows a baby with a hat (a doll in the original version). This video has now been re-filmed with a live baby, and will be shared in the near future.

LL-R are also producing a Dads video featuring the experiences of local fathers. in managing crying babies. The video is currently being filmed and will be shared as soon as it has become available.










NEW ICON POSTERS

BaNES recently organised a really positive conference, focusing on unborn's and under 1's where ICON was presented.


EMIS POP-UP FOR GPS

Well done to ICB Black Country for creating an automatic Pop-Up for GPs, which will act as a prompt at the 6-8 week check. The Pop-Up alert is now live within EMIS and System 1 to remind clinicians to discuss ICON at the 6-8 week check, with the option to print off the ICON leaflet.

The 6-8 week check is Touchpoint 5, and includes a reminder of the ICON message and to give parents/carers the leaflet, as this is when the peak of normal crying is likely to be at its highest, or reaching that point.

The Pop-Up Brief has been circulated to NSG members, but if anyone would like more information, please contact Sue Anslow, or ICB Black Country.

We have been advised that Public Health Wakefield are also looking at developing a Pop-Up reminder for GPs, and we will keep you posted on this.
