Just to remind you of the great opportunity available to promote ICON on digital radio using the fantastic FREE Hush-a-Bye Baby audios clips, that we recently sent you.

South Yorkshire and Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire, Berkshire West are currently working with James Footitt from Bauer Media to run the ads leading up to ICON Week. South Yorkshire have run similar campaigns previously and had fantastic success with an increase in hits to the ICON website, demonstrating it is working and people out there need support.

As ICON have paid for the production and the license, this means you can run these at a significantly reduced cost to yourselves - you would just need to pay for the airtime. Bauer Media can work with any sized budget, but obviously the more budget the more airtime. It is worth trying your partners in public health, family hubs or the safeguarding partnership as well as NHS pots. Bauer will also try to link you to the news desk for your area so you can get some free promotion by having it covered on local radio news.
